Beneficiaries	<p>This Call is addressed to Startups in pre-commercial or very early commercial stage with founders maintaining control of the company, that is, the majority of the share capital and voting rights, and therefore leading the startup’s financial and business decisions.</p> <p>Startups can have their registered office in any country, with the exception of tax havens or non-cooperative tax jurisdictions in accordance with applicable tax regulations and the OCDE/EU criteria. It is not necessary to move to any specific country.</p>	
Budget	<p>Startups admitted to the Program will receive during the acceleration period a contribution of FIVE THOUSAND EUROS (€ 5,000) per month as ordinary funds.</p> <p>Additionally, admitted Startups may request up to a maximum of FORTY THOUSAND EUROS (€ 40,000) per year as extraordinary funds for strategic expenses to achieve the milestones of the Work Plan</p>

Topic description	<p>MSCA Staff Exchanges involve organisations from the academic and non-academic sectors (including SMEs) from across the globe.</p> <p>The organisations constituting the partnership contribute directly to the implementation of a joint R&I project by seconding and/or hosting eligible staff members. Such a project must explore activities that can be based on previous work but should go beyond and generate or strengthen long-term collaborations. Secondments must always take place between legal entities independent from each other.</p> <p>Project results are expected to contribute to the following outcomes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Innovative ways of cooperation and transfer of knowledge between sectors and disciplines; • Strengthened and broader international, interdisciplinary and inter-sectoral collaborative networks; • Boosted R&I capacity. 	
Scope	<p>MSCA Staff Exchanges promote innovative international, inter-sectoral and interdisciplinary collaboration in research and innovation through exchanging staff and sharing knowledge and ideas at all stages of the innovation chain.</p> <p>Proposals under this Action should contribute to the following expected impacts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increase international, interdisciplinary and inter-sectoral mobility of research staff within Europe and beyond through collaborative research networks and activities; • Strengthen the R&I human capital base in Europe and beyond; • Increase Europe's attractiveness as a leading destination for R&I; • Contribute to Europe's competitiveness and growth through high-quality R&I; • Foster the culture of open science, innovation and entrepreneurship.
